## Please attribute the following response to Greater Dandenong City Council, Executive Director City Futures, Sanjay Manivasagasivam:

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal action was withdrawn by the applicant after an agreement was reached between the applicant and Council. The Transfer Station will be removed from the land and the land remediated. This is only in relation to the transfer station component of the land.

The use of part of the land for a transfer station will cease and all materials removed from the land and that part of land will be returned to its condition before the transfer station use commenced. Council anticipates that this will occur by the start of November 2025.

Council and the Environmental Protection Authority are continuing the enforcement process with the other operators and landowners for the remainder of the site, including those areas with the unlawful fill and soil.
